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Director's Note

Selim Evci

In this day and age, we wrestle constantly with a sense of restlessness and dissatisfaction revealed by the unceasing search for happiness.

People today find themselves caught between modernist and traditional thinking. We inhabit an era of freedom and diversity and feel under intense pressure to lead a solitary life. As a consequence, the whole question of marriage and whether to go there can become an agonizingly difficult decision.

The idea that people should get married and make a home goes back a long way culturally. Prevailing thought has been that if a person doesn't marry and have children, their life is all but meaningless. Marriage is therefore something like a destiny imposed on people by society. As time goes by, well-meaning pressure from both family and the community can become overwhelming.

On the other hand, the potential warmth and coziness of family life can also turn marriage into a fulfilling, life-affirming institution over time. This is exactly the dilemma that people face.

People who avoid marriage often tend to steer clear of long-term liaisons because they are wary of commitment, worried by the possibility of experiencing a toxic relationship, unwilling to take on the responsibilities of a serious relationship, afraid of failure or for any number of similar reasons. While they convince themselves that living alone offers the easiest and most comfortable life, managing feelings and always being in a safe space can be challenging.

With this as a starting point, Adrift in Time addresses timeless themes such as marriage, inheritance, death, illness and solitude through its cast of characters. At the same time, the film explores different patterns of human behavior and seeks to understand the characters in the light of their behavior without being in any way judgmental.

At the heart of the story is the predicament of the central character who is motivated by conscience to help out in a situation that he feels he has caused, but unwittingly finds himself in a difficult position in the process.

I conceived Adrift in Time as the first film in a trilogy about relationships. While in this initial instalment I look at singlehood, the second film will consider marriage and the third the themes of old age and separation.



Producer's Note — Mastaneh Mohajer

Adrift in Time is a film about solitude that reaches deep into the recesses of the human heart and mind.

The film derives its strength from seeking to understand its characters through their frailties and portraying them entirely without judgment or prejudice.

To live in limbo is not easy. We are tempted to think that somewhere out there, beyond the boundaries of our existing lives, there is always better. It is these sorts of feelings that inform the fabric of the film.

In terms of structure, Adrift in Time is a minimalist film shaped

largely by feelings and emotions rather than by action.

Consequently, the unspoken carries as much weight as the spoken word. What emerges is a narrative that deals with themes and issues experienced across different cultures around the world. Its universal language and the authenticity of its characters position the film well to speak to any audience.

I met Selim Evci at a festival screening of his previous film, Secret (Saklı). He is a passionate director who likes to explore human instincts and emotions with genuine authenticity. Ultimately, Adrift in Time is a film that I have very much enjoyed working on. I hope that you, too, will feel the same way about it.
